










Living Water want to thank all the individuals and firms, that have made contributions, to make this project possible

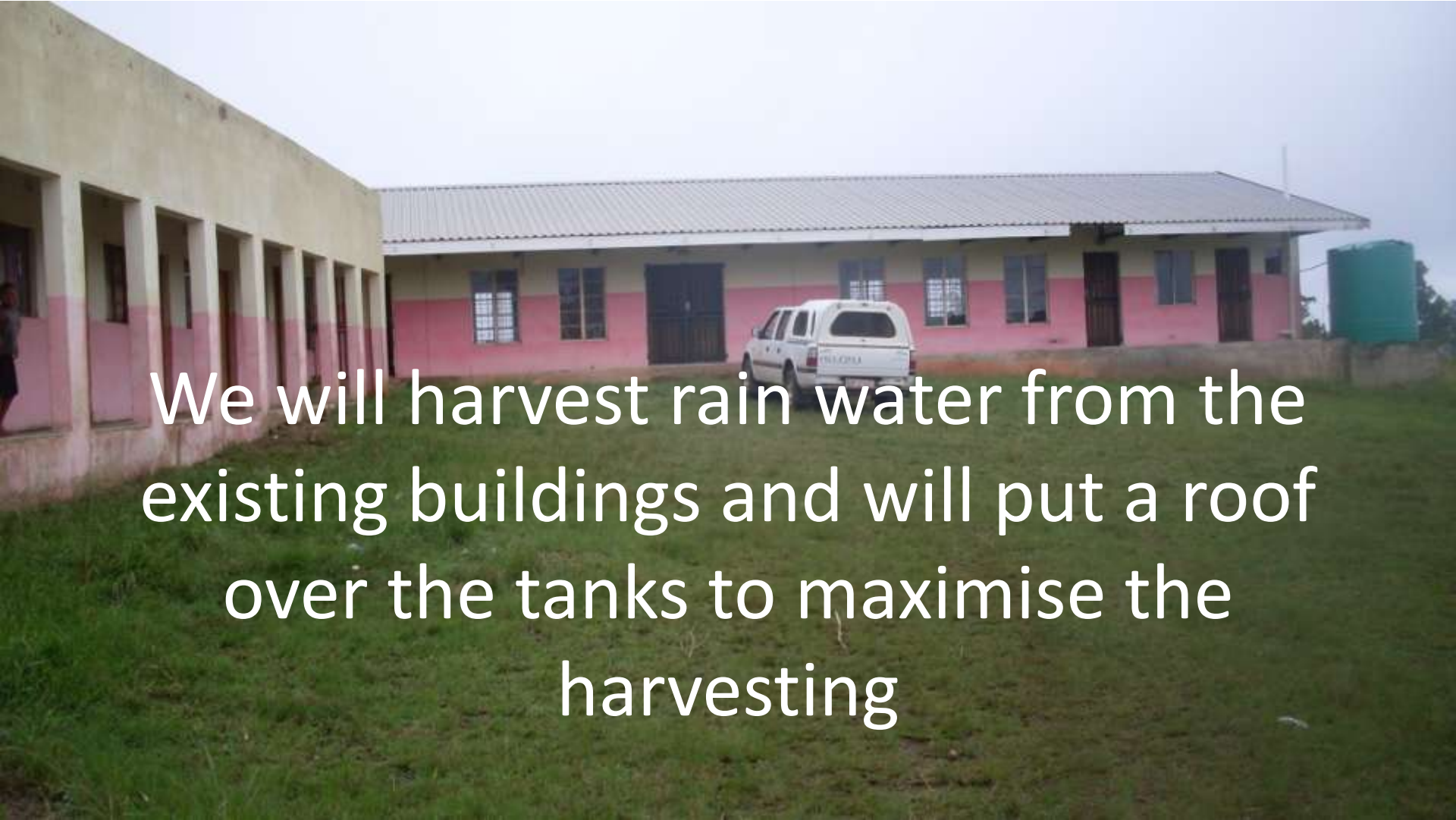





The land the Society will use to teach the people how to cultivate their own vegetables.

To make this a viable project Living Water will have to donate at least 10 x 5000l water tanks


Foundations for farming will go with and do the lectures and practical demonstrations
